World Mission Sunday – Together we are mission

This year for World Mission Sunday, the Mission societies are focussing on Sr. Clara from India, who has dedicated her life to educating vulnerable young girls, giving them the skills to break free from exploitation and abuse. In India, child trafficking and child labour is the reality for around 12 million children. This tragic statistic is staggering. However, it would be far worse without the presence of the Catholic Church. For decades, your support of Missio has enabled local communities to work hard to rescue those who are suffering. Through their devotion and faith, the Sisters help the children to see their worth as a beloved child of God, "We always give them the confidence that Jesus loves them". Once rescued, the girls are provided with a loving, safe home, where the Sisters give them an education, medical care, spiritual formation and counselling.

EU Citizens Settlement Scheme and support for vulnerable EU Citizens

EEA and Swiss citizens and their family members in the UK, will need to apply to secure their rights through a free digital system. This will give them a status in UK law, when we leave the EU. Be assured that there is plenty of time to apply – in a deal scenario, the date for applications to be made is June 30th 2021. In a no deal, applicants have until December 31st 2020. Irish citizens do not need to apply to the EU Settlement Scheme to protect their status and rights. They are covered by Common Travel Area (CTA) arrangements.

As at the beginning of October, less than 2/3 of the eligible applicants have applied. This means that there are an estimated 1 million EU Citizens still to apply. These may include vulnerable people such as the homeless, disabled and elderly. The Catholic Church in England and Wales is committed to supporting such vulnerable citizens, many who may be Catholic. If you know of anyone in this situation, please speak to Canon Isaac or e-mail whitchurch@rcadc.org and we will attempt to support such individuals through their application process.

November – The Month of the Holy Souls

During the month of November, we will pray for the Faithful Departed at Mass every day. We will remember especially those included on the Holy Souls' lists in both Churches. Envelopes and sheets for your family Holy Souls' list are available at the back of both Churches. They can be handed in to the sacristy, dropped into the presbytery or placed in the collection plate.

November – Requiem Mass for those who have died recently

On Saturday, November 11th at 10am, we will have a Requiem Mass for all the departed whose funerals have been held in the parish during the last year. Everyone is invited to come along and remember the deceased of the parish.

November – Remembrance Sunday

On Sunday, November 12th, the 11am Mass will be a Requiem to pray for those who have died in war. Following the 11am Mass on November 12th, Canon Isaac will bless the graves at the Pantmawr Cemetery.

November – Clergy Requiem

The annual Requiem Mass for the Clergy of the Archdiocese will be celebrated by Archbishop Stack and the Archdiocesan Clergy on Tuesday, November 19th at 12.45pm in St. David's Cathedral, Cardiff. We are all encouraged to go along to pray for those deceased priests who have served us so faithfully.

Making Funeral Arrangements

There is literature at the back of the Church to assist those families and individuals who want to make sure that they have prepared for their funerals in advance. Being prepared means that you do not put pressure on family, friends and loved ones at the time of their bereavement. The Bishops' Conference of England and Wales has created a helpful checklist for those beginning to think about their funerals.
