Dial For Mass

A service for those of our parishioners and others, who are without access to the Internet. Ring to access our 'Dial for Mass' service. Mass will be available each Sunday from about 2.00pm and you can hear the previous Sunday's Mass by ringing the service at any time of day or night during the week.

The number is a local number from Cardiff based landlines – 22 670 999. If you are dialling from outside Cardiff or from a mobile phone, you will need to dial 029 2267 0999. Call charges will apply dependent on your contract with your phone company. Some people have free calls as part of their packages, either all the time or during weekends. If you do not have a free call plan, please remember that Mass will last around 35 to 40 minutes most Sundays and at the BT local call rate of 20p per minute so the call could cost up to £8.

If you are in contact with a parishioner who does not have Internet access, please let them know this service is available.

Fathers' Day

Today we mark Fathers' Day. Although the celebration of Fathers' Day is a modern invention imported from the United States of America, it is important that we congratulate all the fathers of the parish today. A big thank you to all the fathers who play such a key role in building up family life and contributing with your families in the life of the parish.

We will pray especially for all Fathers and Grandfathers during the bidding prayers of today's Mass.

The Feast of the Nativity of St. John the Baptist

On Wednesday, we celebrate the Nativity of St. John the Baptist. Wednesday's feast honours St. John as the forerunner of Christ. John's birth, announced by the angel and greeted with acclaim and promise, parallels that of Jesus. An angelic annunciation prepares the way, as the Angel Gabriel visits Zechariah to tell him that his wife Elizabeth is with child. The doubting father finds himself unable to speak, until the scene described in today's Gospel. There, Zechariah confirms in writing that the new-born child will be called John. Zechariah's tongue is loosed and he begins to praise God, causing fear and marvelling among all who hear the story. On this feast, six months before the birth of Jesus, we prepare ourselves to welcome the Lord anew in our life, as Zechariah and Elizabeth welcomed their son John.

St. Peter and St. Paul - Transferred

It is the practice of the Church in England and Wales that, if a Holyday of Obligation falls on a Saturday or a Monday, it will be transferred to the Sunday. Though the obligation to attend Mass is currently suspended due to the Pandemic, the liturgical calendar was agreed at the beginning of the year, therefore the Solemnity of St. Peter and St. Paul, normally on June 29th will be transferred to next Sunday, June 28th.

Mass Times

As has now become familiar, Mass will be broadcast from St. Teilo's live at 10am each day including Sunday.

You are encouraged, not only to listen and watch the Mass, but to take part by making the responses in your own home.

At Communion time each day, I will lead us in praying St. Alphonse Liguori's Act of Spiritual Communion:

My Jesus,
I believe that You
are present in the Most Holy Sacrament.
I love You above all things,
and I desire to receive You into my soul.
Since I cannot at this moment
receive You sacramentally,
come at least spiritually into my heart.
I embrace You as if You were already there and unite myself wholly to You.

Opening St. Teilo's for private prayer. An invitation to help

As I mentioned in last week's newsletter, we were still awaiting confirmation from the First Minister of the date for the opening of churches for private prayer. On Friday, June 19th, the First Minister confirmed that churches may open for private prayer from this coming week. But for practical reasons our target for opening the Church will be Monday, June 29th. In preparation for the re-opening, we are now beginning to draw up a rota of stewards and cleaners who will work to ensure that St. Teilo's can be open for private prayer during certain periods of each week.

Paul Doherty, the Parish Health and Safety Officer, has completed a detailed review of St. Teilo's and reported the outcomes to the Archdiocesan Buildings Manager, who will evaluate the parish response before confirming, or otherwise, the ability of the Church to open. In undertaking this review, Paul has used the National Guidance to develop a Parish Plan for the opening of St. Teilo's. At this point, we need the help of a group of people to act as stewards and cleaners.

Stewards

There will need to be three stewards in the Church for each hour of opening, with a hand-over, without hand contact, between one hour and the next.

Two stewards will ensure that hand sanitisation occurs at the entry and exit doors; these stewards will also ensure that people with cold or flu-like symptoms do not enter the Church. The third steward will ensure that social distancing is maintained by people in the Church and that people follow the directions signs in the Church. They will also notify the door stewards if the Church is full, within the confines of the reduced capacity.

Where possible, each group of stewards will have one member who is approved for safeguarding. In due course, all stewards will be asked to complete a Disclosure and Barring

Service (DBS) check for safeguarding.

Mel Hopkins and Carole Burns have agreed to act as the co-ordinators for reopening. They will maintain a rota and ensure that stewards know when they will be on duty. They will also keep contact details of stewards and cleaners to ensure that there is sufficient coverage in case of illness or other delays.

Cleaners

A full clean of the Church will be necessary before and after each period of opening. More frequent cleaning will be needed for areas and surfaces, which people touch and may leave the virus. We need three or four volunteer cleaners for each day that the Church is to be open: one to ensure that the Church is clean up to an hour before opening, one to clean the Church after closing and one per hour to be available to clean benches that have been used between one person or family leaving and another arriving.

Initial Opening Times

Once it has been announced that churches can be open for private prayer, we intend to trial opening from **2pm to 4pm on Mondays and Fridays**. While this is a limited period, it reflects the demands placed on volunteers to fulfil the roles I have highlighted above.

Volunteers

We are now seeking volunteers who can take on the roles of stewards and/or cleaners for the opening of the Church. Due to the nature of the virus and the impact it is having, volunteers must be above the age of 18 and below the age of 60. Volunteers must also not suffer from any of the higher risk co-morbidities of Covid-19 i.e. cardiovascular disease, diabetes, chronic respiratory disease, hyperlipidaemia, rheumatoid arthritis, immuno-deficiency, cancer and anxiety/depression.

If you are of the appropriate age and do not have any of the co-morbidities, can stand unaided for up to an hour and would be willing to volunteer, please email Mel Hopkins - melfyn.hopkins@sky.com and let him know

- Your name
- Contact details – phone and email
- Age range (18-30, 30-40, 40-50. 50-59)
- Confirmation that you do not have a raised risk of Covid-19 infection
- Whether you want to Steward or Clean or both
- Which hours and days, of those above, you are able to volunteer
- Whether you will be available: weekly; fortnightly; monthly

Please note that sanitiser and appropriate PPE will be available for stewards. Approved cleaning materials will be available for cleaners.

Some of these requirements may seem extreme but the Church has a duty of care to all involved in the re-opening process. Our insurance providers have set certain limits as to who can volunteer in the Church during these unusual times and we need to take their limits into consideration, as well as the Government's guidelines, as we begin to re-open the Church.

Congratulations

In recognition of his unstinting and dedicated work as Chancellor of the Diocese and his contribution to the establishment of the National Tribunal for Wales, the Archbishop has appointed Fr. David a Canon of the Cathedral Chapter. So, we will need to learn to call him Canon David Hayman from now on.

Parish Finance

I do not like writing or speaking about finance and associated topics! However, I feel that the parish has the right to know our financial position at the time of the Pandemic. Obviously, with lockdown, things have changed. Life has changed for us all and it will be different for some time to come.

I thank most sincerely the parishioners who have sent their contributions to the parish by cheque, by an envelope through the letterbox, by standing order and via the online donation page. Your thoughtfulness and support for the life of the parish is much appreciated, as are the lovely messages I receive by email, letterbox and telephone; they are a real encouragement at a difficult time.

The facts of our parish situation are as follows: each month our parish income is down around £3,500 each month compared with last year. Our normal expenditure has not gone down at the same time, as we do not use much heat and light at this time of the year. If the lockdown were to continue for a year, we would overspend by £24,000. We have very generous parishioners who think of the Church and her continuing life in the parish. I know that some of our senior parishioners are keeping their weekly collections together at home, ready for the time when things get back to normal! Thank You.

If you are able to contribute by standing order and do not do so already, please could you do so, to help the parish cash flow and our planning for the future. In May, our standing order contributions were £2,134.50 up £600 since January. Our donations via the [Donation link](#) on the parish website last week were £223. Thank you for all you do to support the Church. When things develop and the Finance Committee is able to meet, I will ask them to complete a summary of our situation ready for the next stage of our parish life.

I would like to remind you that no parishioner should feel guilty or worried about our situation. I know a number of our parish families are struggling and worrying about the future. The outcome of the pandemic will mean hard times in employment and other financial issues for many and no one should put themselves or their family at jeopardy for the sake of the Church. Only give what you can do within your financial resources. I am grateful to so many who support the parish in this and many other ways. We do what we can. Do not feel guilty if you can do no more financially, you can still pray and come to know the Lord more and more.

Please continue to use the streaming of Mass and adoration every day with Benediction at 5:30pm. The Church is available to view for 24 hours, so you can view the Altar and Our Lord present in the Blessed Sacrament at any time. Make use of this opportunity and remind yourself and your families that the Church has not gone away, that it is here, as the Lord wished and as He continues to care for us all. We are the Church and coming together spiritually is more important than coming together physically. May we live out our faith in practice, in our prayer and in our lives.



Family time


Talk Why do people find it difficult to tell others that they go to church and believe in God?

Haydn Blackey writes:

I would like to thank all the parishioners for their generosity and kindness at this time of bereavement at the loss of my father. The number of cards, emails, Facebook messages and telephone calls have been almost overwhelming as have the Mass Intentions offered for him.

My Dad died peacefully and without pain at the age of 85, which was a great mercy for us. He was cared for extremely well by the carers and nurses at his Nursing Home during his time living there. Even though lockdown had meant my two siblings and I had only had weekly WhatsApp video chats with Dad in recent weeks, the Home ensured that both my sister and I (my brother lives in Australia), were able to visit him face to face just before the end. Dad told us that he was feeling tired and was ready to go. We have many fond memories to draw on as we say goodbye to him. Dad was a convert to the faith in his forties, having supported my Mam in bringing us up as Catholics as he promised when they married. A MESSAGE ON CHURCH OPENING FROM GEORGE STACK, ARCHBISHOP OF CARDIFF

The Archdiocese of Cardiff and the Dioceses of Menevia and Wrexham welcome the announcement by the First Minister that churches may be opened for private prayer from Monday 22nd June 2020. In the interests of your continued safety, given the measures that will need to be put in place in the coming days, it seems that Saturday 28th June will be the likely date for those churches who fulfil the health and safety requirements to be opened for a specific time to be announced. With the re-opening of churches, certain responsibilities are laid on both the parish and the diocese to ensure the health and safety of those who come to pray. Amongst these are the following:

1. Each parish will need to decide the hours of opening and these times will be published on the diocesan website, once the Risk Assessment has been made and the Health and Safety certificate has been issued.
2. Everyone visiting the church will be required to follow the necessary guidelines and signage to ensure the safety of all.
3. Each parish will need to provide two or three volunteers to ensure the safe flow and placement of people – seating, distance, cleaning, signage, stewards etc.

PLEASE NOTE:

- a. That the obligation to attend Mass on Sunday remains dispensed.
- b. That social distancing (currently two metres) must be observed – except for household groups.
- c. Each person must sanitise his or her hands on entering and leaving the church.

- d. Should a person feel unwell, or has been to an infected place in the past 14 days, he or she should not enter the Church.
- e. That the numbers entering the church will be restricted – depending on the seating available. One-way entry and exit paths will need to be established.
- f. That churches must be cleaned every day prior to opening, and portions cleaned during the time it is opened. Special attention must be paid to pews and door handles. Where possible, windows should be open. Air circulation helps reduce infection.
- g. Hymn books, prayer books, pamphlets and leaflets and other items may not be left around for people to handle.
- i. That those who are “shielded” or self-isolating must remain at home and not come to the church for private prayer.
- j. Some of our churches will be unable to fulfil these requirements through being too small, or not being able to recruit the necessary volunteer stewards or cleaners. Hopefully, the main church in each deanery will be able to welcome visitors from elsewhere.
- k. Face coverings may be worn, but are not strictly necessary. Their use is voluntary and not disrespectful to prayer before the Blessed Sacrament or the sacred space, which is the church.
- l. Parents and guardians bringing children to the church should be mindful to care for them, particularly by ensuring they touch as few surfaces as possible for their own safety.
