Weekday Mass now open to the public without the need to pre-book

In line with the careful relaxations in the Covid-19 regulations which the Welsh Government will implement from Monday, April 12th, Mass at St. Teilo's will, from this date, be open to the public.

Mass will continue to be celebrated at St. Teilo's at 10am each day and from Monday to Saturday will be open to the public without any need to pre-book.

You will still need to abide by the following restrictions.

- You will only attend Mass if you are able to confirm that you currently show no symptoms of Covid-19.
- You will wear a face-covering/mask in Church at all times, except to receive Holy Communion
- You will provide the door steward with your name and telephone number for Track and Trace purposes.
- You will use hand-sanitiser as you enter and exit the building.
- You should arrive between 20 and 5 minutes before the start time of Mass.
- Please allow a Steward to show you to your seat.
- Please wait to be invited up to Holy Communion.
- Please refrain from talking to your friends who are not part of your household/bubble while in or near the building.
- It should be noted that there will be **no toilet facilities available**.

There will still be a restriction of 30 households or household bubbles in the Church. So, in the exceptional circumstances when 30 households have arrived before you, you will understand if you have to be turned away. This occurrence has not happened at weekday Mass, but we must adhere to this restriction for the Church to retain Covid-Secure status

Sunday Mass Attendance

From next Sunday, bookings for Sunday Mass will be made via [the parish's online booking service](#). Please click the "Select a Date button on the page" and choose April 18th. If you are unable to book online due to an absence of internet connection, then you can contact Carole Burns who will arrange to book you a place in advance of general booking. Carole will make contact with those whom she knows do not have internet access to make these arrangements. If you do not have Internet access and have not previously been in touch with Carole please ring the Presbytery – 029 2062 3444 – and leave a message for Carole to get back to you.

The Bishops' Conference of England and Wales has confirmed that the obligation to attend Sunday Mass remains suspended. So please do not feel under any pressure to attend the Church when online or phone Masses are valid alternatives.

If you wish to attend Sunday Mass

- You **must** book if you wish to attend Sunday Mass. We do not want to turn people away at the door, so if you have not booked in advance – PLEASE DO NOT ATTEND.
- By registering to attend Mass, you confirm the following conditions are met:
 - You currently show no symptoms for Coronavirus.
 - Should you develop symptoms prior to the service, you will NOT attend.
 - You agree to wear a face-covering/mask throughout the service.
 - You agree to use hand-sanitiser as a condition of entry.
- It should be noted that there will be **no toilet facilities available**.
- You should arrive between 20 and 5 minutes before the start time of Mass.
- Please allow a Steward to show you to your seat.
- Please wait to be invited up to Holy Communion.
- Please refrain from talking to your friends who are not part of your household.
- No congregational singing is allowed at Mass and any responses should be made in a low tone, as singing and loud voices have been shown to spread the virus further.

Additional Sunday Mass Times

In the next few weeks, we are hoping to open up the Church to additional celebrations of the Sunday liturgy at 6.00pm on Saturday Evenings and 6.30pm on Sunday Evenings. Our ability to hold masses at these additional times over the weekend is entirely dependent on our stewards. If you are able to volunteer for any of the three Sunday Masses, then please email Mel Hopkins – melfyn.hopkins@sky.com and let him know. As soon as Mel is able to confirm the appropriate number of stewards, the additional Masses will be advertised in the newsletter. Please provide Mel with:

- Your name
- Contact details – phone and email
- Age range (18-30, 30-40, 40-50, 50-59, over 60)
- Confirmation that you do not have a raised risk of Covid-19 infection
- For which Sunday Mass (Saturday Vigil Mass 6pm, Sunday Morning Mass 10am or Sunday evening Mass 6.30pm) you are able to volunteer.
- Whether you will be available: weekly; fortnightly; monthly

Weekday Mass Stewards

If you are able and willing to steward at one of the Weekday Masses, please email whitchurch@rcadc.org confirming which days you would be available to steward. As ever, the more stewards we have, the less burden this will be on each individual.

Readers' Rotas

We will soon be restarting the readers' rota for both Sunday and Weekday Masses. Much has changed since the last rotas were produced in February 2020, so may we ask anyone, who is willing and able to read at Mass, to email whitchurch@rcadc.org to confirm their availability for either Weekday and/or Sunday Masses. Sunday readers are asked to indicate whether they would prefer to read on Saturday at 6pm, Sunday at 10am or Sunday at 6.30pm Masses, in the hope that sufficient stewards will be available to allow each of these Masses to take place. Weekday readers should indicate if there are any days of the week when they would prefer to read and any days, they would not be able to do so.

Servers' Rotas

Currently we are allowed no more than four servers socially distanced at each Mass. In the hope that we will return to three Sunday Masses in future weeks, could I ask servers, or parents of servers, to let us know which Mass they or their child will be able to serve. Once we have the names, we will create a rota, so that there are four servers, where possible, at each Mass.

Dial for Mass

We continue to operate the 'Dial for Mass' scheme for those who do not have access to the Internet and cannot attend in person. Ring to access our 'Dial for Mass' service. Mass will be available each Sunday from about 2pm and you can hear the previous Sunday's Mass by ringing the service at any time of day or night during the week. The number is a local number from Cardiff based landlines – 22 670 999. If you are dialling from outside Cardiff or from a mobile phone, you will need to dial 029 2267 0999.

Many thanks to the family from Llandysul who sent a very kind message and offered a Triduum of Masses for Fr. Dwayne and the parish for providing this service as they access it in an area where live streaming is not possible. It is lovely to know that our efforts to reach out to people during the pandemic is continuing to have an impact far away from the parish.

Confessions – Sacrament of Reconciliation

Fr. Dwayne will be available for Confessions after Mass on Saturday – Confessions will take place in the presbytery garden or in the Parish Hall if it is wet. Father is also available to hear confessions after Mass on other days on request.

Divine Mercy Sunday



Divine Mercy
Sunday

1st Sunday after Easter
Our Lord's words to Saint Faustina
regarding Divine Mercy Sunday:

*"The soul that will go to Confession and receive Holy Communion
shall obtain complete forgiveness of sin and punishment." (Diary #698)*

Today is celebrated as Divine Mercy Sunday. St. Pope John Paul II declared Divine Mercy Sunday as a Feast of the Universal Church in 2000, on the occasion of the Canonisation of Sister Faustina Kowalska. St. Faustina was prompted by the Lord to promote the [Chaplet of Divine Mercy](#), the [3.00pm Prayer](#) and the [Feast of Divine Mercy](#), including the [Novena](#) which leads up to it. Over many years in Cardiff, Divine Mercy Sunday has been celebrated at St. Alban's, the Church which is now the home of the Oratory of St. Philip Neri in formation, Cardiff.

On Divine Mercy Sunday, a Sung Mass of Divine Mercy with Blessing of the Divine Mercy Image will take place at 10am at St. Alban's. At 3pm, the 3 o'clock Prayer & Chaplet of Divine Mercy will be prayed followed by the Act of Consecration to Jesus and a communal Act of Veneration of the Divine Mercy image. Individual veneration is not possible owing to Covid-19 guidance. The 3pm devotions will be followed at 4pm by Solemn Vespers and Benediction of the Blessed Sacrament.

St. Alban's is a large church, so even with social distancing, it will not be necessary to book to attend Mass or the afternoon devotions. However, a mask must be worn in the Church. If you are not able to attend in person, you can access Mass and devotions on the [Oratory You Tube Channel](#).


Catholic People

New Archdiocesan Evangelisation Programme

The Diocesan Evangelisation Commission is pleased to announce its new programme:
Spread the Gospel: Developing a Missionary Parish.

The Commission has spent the year of lockdown creating the programme and then piloting, reviewing, and amending it. The Programme has been approved by His Grace, Archbishop George Stack. It is a seven-week programme, running for one and half hours via Zoom on one evening a week. The dates will be Wednesday, April 21st and 28th, May 5th, May 12th and May 19th, June 9th and June 16th. It will be delivered by members of the Evangelisation Commission.

The Programme is open to all parishioners and clergy across the Archdiocese.

The new Programme will remind participants of the Great Commission and the basic Gospel message. It will cover a rudimentary history of the early church and will consider important messages from recent papal papers, how to give witness testimonies, evangelise non-church going Catholics with practical approaches and tools for building a parish team to evangelise. The Genesis Mission will be an important follow-on activity offered to participants, providing the necessary skills for successful encounters.




